The A WORLD OF DIFFERENCE® Institute's **Becoming an Ally: Responding to Name-Calling and Bullying Behaviors Workshop** provides students in grades 4-12 with the knowledge, awareness and skills to respond to name-calling and bullying behaviors, and to create safe and respectful school environments. With current studies indicating that over 28% of U.S students have been bullied in school, the Dignity Act is recommending that schools take steps to address these concerns.



Goals:

- Develop an understanding of name-calling and bullying behaviors
- Learn how to be an effective ally to targets of name-calling and bullying
- Empower students with skills to address name-calling and bullying behaviors and de-escalating hate throughout the school

Services:

- **Student Training**— Half day (3 hours) or Full day (6 hours) workshop that develops personal mechanisms to reduce name-calling and bullying situations
- **Did You Know?**— Both educators and students are often unsure how to respond effectively when they witness bullying and **90% of youth bystanders opt to do nothing.**
