- **Attend the celebratory closing event (with supervising attorneys) and other ADL supporters where SARP participants will have the opportunity to celebrate and share their research and summer experience.**
- **For supervising attorneys:** We ask that supervising attorneys participate in one preliminary conference call prior to the beginning of the summer to meet other partners and review the ADL research topics.
- Other opportunities to engage and network with fellow participants over the summer may arise.
