"STOP HATE FOR PROFIT" HOLDS WEEK OF ACTION

Last week, members of the <u>Stop Hate For Profit</u> coalition and its network of tens of thousands of supporters across the country joined in a coordinated week of action on Instagram, demanding parent company Facebook take action to address hate, extremism and disinformation on its platforms.

On September 16th, the coalition participated in a one-day freeze of Instagram. Celebrities such as Sacha Baron Cohen. Naomi Campbell, Jennifer Lawrence, Jason Alexander, Jamie Foxx, Leonardo DiCaprio, Michael B. Jordan, Kim Kardashian, and many more all posted and shared the call to #StopHateForProfit.

This campaign calls on Facebook to:

- Swiftly and meaningfully address electoral misinformation and widespread racism and hate on their platform
- Change platform policy to forbid any event page that contains a call to arms
- Allocate additional resources to allow for the comprehensive enforcement of policies around groups focused on white supremacy, militia, racism, antisemitism, Islamophobia, violent conspiracies, vaccine misinformation, and climate denialism
- Commit 5% of their annual revenue to an independently administered fund to support initiatives, academics and organizations doing the work to fight racism and hate


