Recently, ADL's Center on Extremism released its annual report: <u>Murder and</u> <u>Extremism in the U.S.</u> revealing the continuing threat of violence posed by extremists. White supremacists and other right-wing extremists were linked to most of the 29 extremist-related murders in the United States in 2021 and have been responsible for 75 percent of such murders over the past decade.
