ADL's Center for Technology and Society (CTS) conducts an annual survey of hate and harassment Americans face online. The 2022 results show that hate and harassment remain at alarming levels. Forty percent of all those surveyed, and nearly half of American teens, report that they have experienced some form of online harassment.

Commemorated each year in the month of June, LGBTQ+ Pride Month honors the 1969 Stonewall uprising in New York City, when patrons and supporters of the Stonewall Inn staged an uprising to resist police harassment and persecution subjected by LGBTQ+ Americans. This uprising marked the beginning of a movement to outlaw discriminatory laws and practices against LGBTQ+ Americans. Today, LGBTQ+ Pride Month celebrations include pride parades, picnics, parties, workshops, symposia and concerts, attracting millions of participants around the world.
