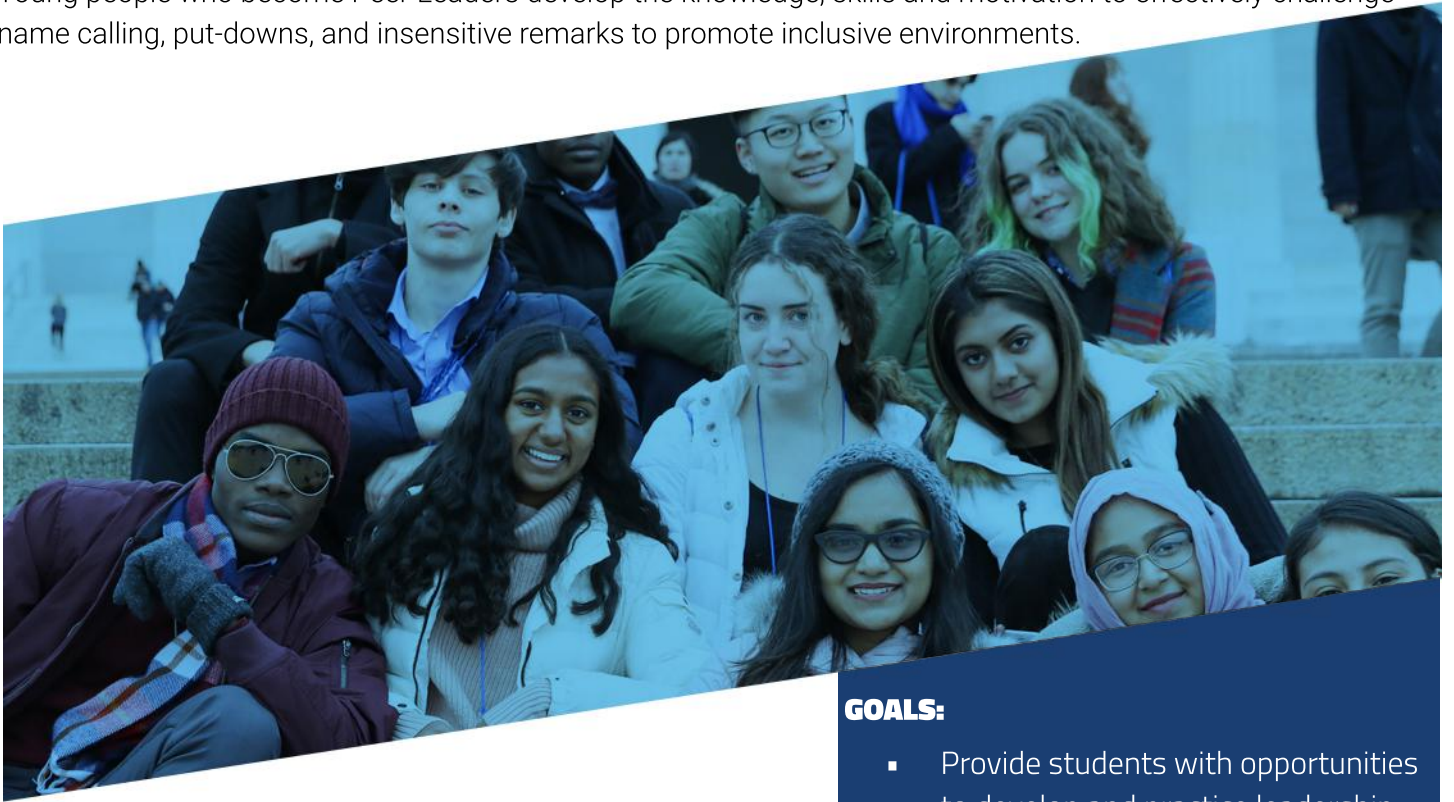


PEER LEADERSHIP

PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS

The **A World Of Difference® Institute Peer Leadership Program** provides middle and high school students with opportunities to develop leadership skills through anti-bias projects in their schools and communities. Young people who become Peer Leaders develop the knowledge, skills and motivation to effectively challenge name calling, put-downs, and insensitive remarks to promote inclusive environments.



SERVICES:

- Peer Leadership Workshops: Two-day interactive training which provides students with the knowledge, resources and skills to respond to bias and prejudice in their everyday lives
- Manual for Peer Leaders: Resources and activity guide for students with suggestions and worksheets to create action plans
- Peer Leadership Coordinator In-service: Workshops for school-based coordinators of the Peer Leadership Program
- Manual for Peer Leadership Coordinators: Comprehensive manual detailing the implementation of the Peer Leadership program at school sites.

GOALS:

- Provide students with opportunities to develop and practice leadership and social action skills
- Provide a forum where young people can learn about and discuss bias and discrimination
- Use positive peer influence to promote healthy, supportive and respectful educational environments
- Develop social responsibility, critical thinking and problem solving skills through action based projects
